Megan discussed the reporting requirements for LEA regarding Missing Persons. Any and all LEA should immediately assist anyone who reports a missing persons. A missing persons takes priority over a theft call. If a missing persons is not in the jurisdiction of agency being reported to, agency shall take an initial report then advise county of jurisdiction and forward a copy of the initial report.

If juvenile is MP, LE will notify school district within 10 days of report. If juvenile is reported missing and immediately found, LE SHALL submit to DOJ the report and dental records for future filing.

There are currently 19K active MP cases in California.

A juvenile under 10 should NEVER be entered as a runaway. Never leave a DOB blank, use a "Dummy" DOB, it can be changed at a later date.

Entry into MUPS for an MP is now 2 hours, not 4 hours. Dental records needs to be entered within 30 days and X-rays need to be entered within 60 days.

AG's Office shall code and enter dental records.

Denise introduce Chelsea. Chelsea discussed Automated Firearm System (Stolen Firearms). Criminal History- Felony convictions and misdemeanor convictions that prevent from having a firearm.

2019 Legislation- Mental Health, Lifetime firearm ban on a person who has been taken into custody, assessed, and admitted to a designated facility because he/she is a danger to themselves or others as a result of mental health disorder and who has previously been taken into custody, assessed and admitted one or more times within in a year.

Carry Concealed- Training Course to be at least 8 hours, no more than 16 hours, Demonstration and proficiency must be demonstrated by applicant for every firearm. Live fire shooting exercise must be conducted at a firing range. Licensing authority to establish standards and make available to the public.
